Integration of beekeeping into the banana coffee system

Forest Fruit Foods Limited is an agro-based processing company which supports over 640 households in Southwestern Uganda. They specialize in the processing honey and banana juice under the brand names “Heritage Taste” and “Eshandy.”

The declining coffee pollinators

In comparison to elsewhere in the world, the coffee yield per tree in Uganda is very low. In fact, production volumes of Arabica and Robusta at farm level are well below the national targets.

In addition to the adverse effects of climate change and weather variability, the population of pollinators such as bees is declining due to changes in the eco system caused by human activities. A reduction of pollinators reduces the rate at which flowers are fertilized which causes a drop in coffee berry development.

Benefits of integrating beekeeping

Forest Fruit Foods Limited will establish apiculture incubation hubs near coffee farms and equip coffee farmers with specialized skills in apiculture. The integration of bee keeping into the banana coffee ecosystem will improve pollination rates leading to increases in coffee berries and consequently production.

Coffee farmers will also receive training on how to maximize the benefits of both beekeeping and coffee production which will help them to diversity their incomes.
